# Conservation Tillage and Precision Agriculture Equipment Tax Credit

(This new refundable credit replaces the Conservation Tillage Equipment Tax Credit and the Fertilizer and Pesticide Application Equipment Tax Credit.)

#### What is it?

A state income tax credit equal to 25% of the cost of the equipment; the amount of the credit cannot exceed \$17,500.

## You may qualify to claim this tax credit if:

- You are engaged in agricultural production for market.
- You have a soil conservation plan approved by your local Soil & Water Conservation District.
- You have a Nutrient Management Plan developed by a certified nutrient management planner.
- You purchase certain equipment designed to reduce soil compaction and disturbance, <u>OR</u> to more precisely apply fertilizers and pesticides.

## What kind of equipment qualifies?

- Equipment to reduce soil compaction and disturbance
  - o "No till" planters and drills, including those attached to equipment you already own;
  - o Guidance systems to control traffic patterns designed to reduce soil disturbance
- Precision fertilizer and pesticide application equipment
  - Equipment that meets the standards set by the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board
    - A copy of these standards is available upon request

#### To apply for this credit:

<u>Virginia Form AEC (including required enclosures)</u> must be sent to the Virginia Department of Taxation <u>at least 90 days before you file your return</u>.

#### **Required Enclosures:**

- 1) A invoice/bill of sale showing the purchase date and cost of the eligible equipment.
- 2) A certified statement signed by the producer, as well as the individual who prepared the Nutrient Management Plan, stating that the nutrient management plan is being implemented. You will need to request this from your Nutrient Management Planner.
- 3) A letter from the local Soil & Water Conservation District certifying the producer has an approved soil conservation plan. You will need to request this letter from your Soil & Water Conservation District. This may take up to 30 days.

The Virginia Department of Taxation will send you a letter certifying your credit once the application has been processed.

You must have this certification letter from the Dept. of Taxation to claim the credit.
