The Shenandoah Valley Soil & Water Conservation District (SVSWCD) is a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Conservation District works with federal, state, and local agencies to provide technical assistance and promote natural resource conservation. The SVSWCD serves Page County, Rockingham County, and the City of Harrisonburg. Programs are administered by District staff under the supervision of the District Manager and the Board of Directors. The Board consists of six locally elected members and two appointed members.

The District receives funding from sources including local, state, and federal entities. Funding from all three sources supports District operational expenses including staff salaries, supplies, equipment, and other essential operating costs. The District coordinates and administers a variety of programs encompassing many aspects of natural resource conservation. Not only is operational funding essential to the District's programs, activities, and services, but it is also vital to implementation of conservation practices.
